These tables show the racial make-up for the youth (under 18) population of each county in 2010 (left) and the change in each racial group's share of the youth population since 2000 (right). While Denver has the highest share of Hispanic and black youths, it's youth racial make-up changed little in the past decade. All other counties, however, saw significant increases in the Hispanic share of the youth population. Arapahoe County also saw a notable increase in its black youth population.

\*Broomfield was not a county in 2000. The 2000 data for Broomfield is composed from parts of Adams, Boulder, Jefferson and Weld Counties.

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
